Abstract:

I will show how mathematics has changed how both of these infections are treated, how it has helped speed up drug development, and in the case of HCV how it is helping increase the cure rate. In addition, I will survey what I think are the important problems that need to be addressed in the still developing field of “viral dynamics”.
